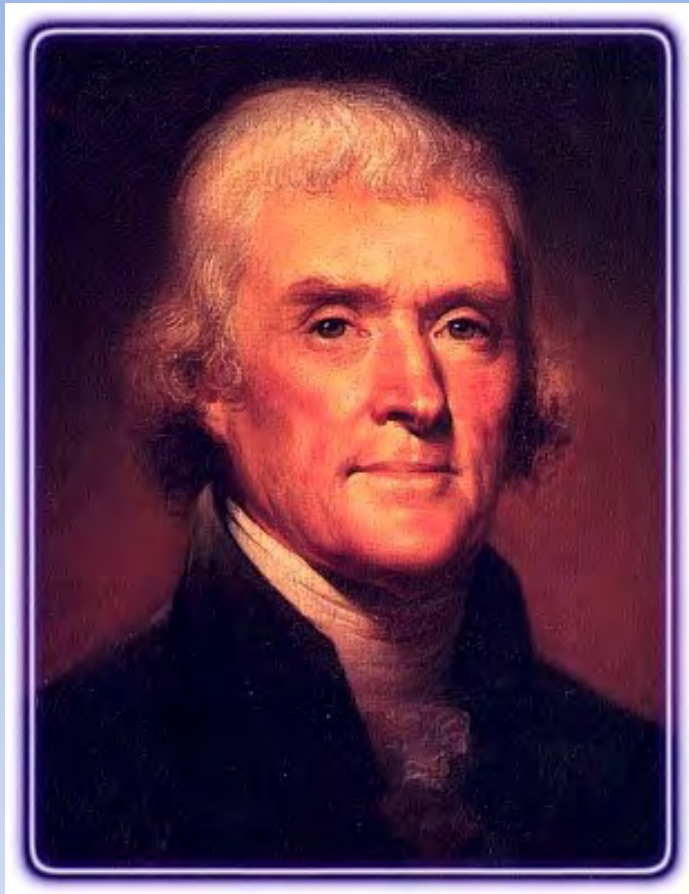

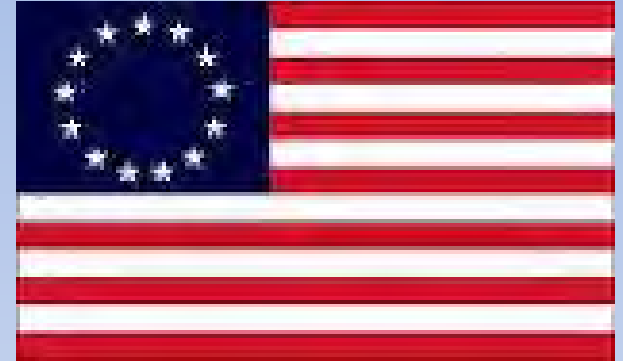

You don't shoot to kill, you shoot to stay alive

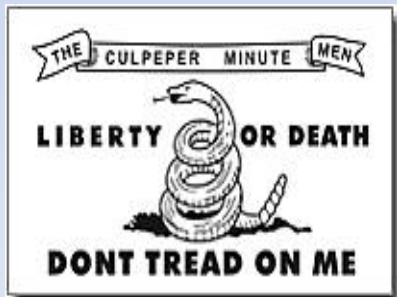
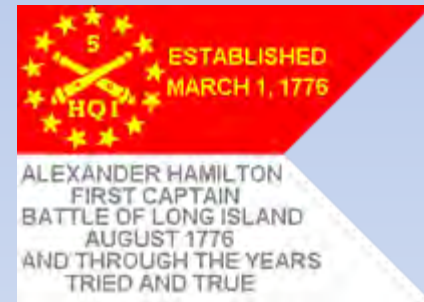
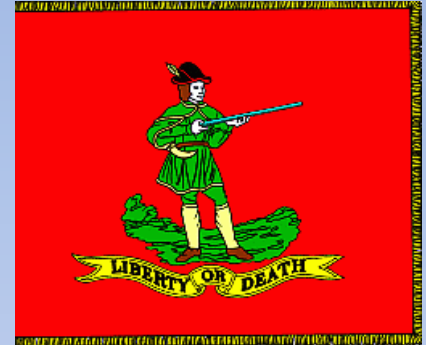

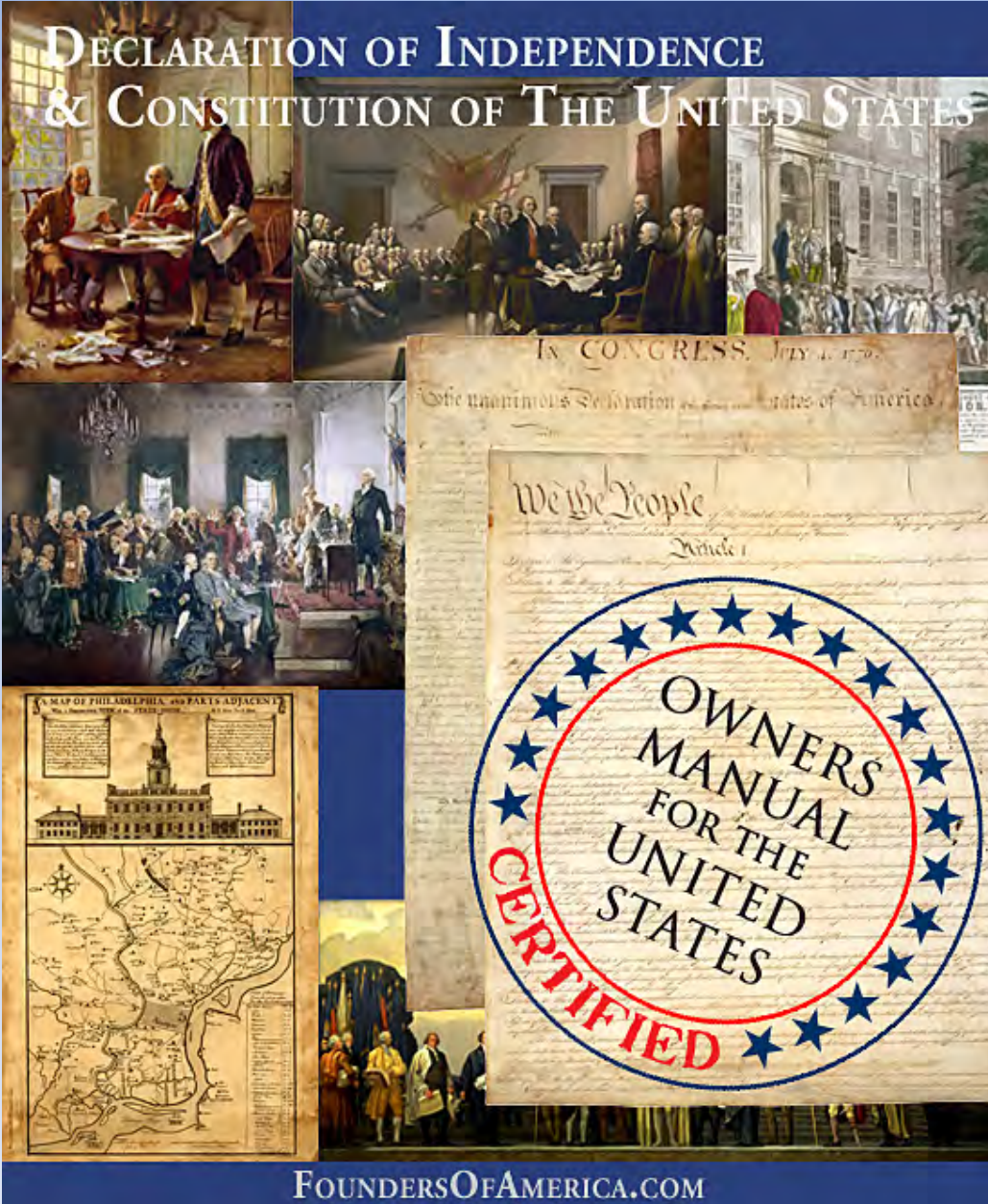
The American Revolution would never have happened with gun control

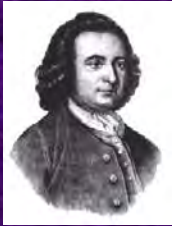

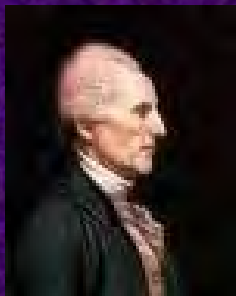
